## **FWMoA Announces New Hours** **Extended hours and adjusted admission prices**

December 4, 2012 (Fort Wayne, IN) -- The Fort Wayne Museum of Art is pleased to announce it is extending its open hours by one hour to open at 10am, except Sunday.

### **New hours:**

Tuesday-Saturday 10-6pm  
Thursday 10-8pm  
Sunday 12-5pm

Additionally, FWMoA is launching **Last Saturday Dollar Days**. On the last Saturday of each month, visitors will pay just \$1 for admission to the FWMoA galleries. The Museum will be discontinuing free admission during the day on Thursdays. However, the Museum will continue to offer free admission on Sundays, as well as free admission Tuesday-Sunday to military service men and women, veterans, and their families.

Gallery admission price changes will go into effect beginning January 1.
